COVID-19 Precautions

(Anyone who feels sick may not attend this event)

1. All guests who are Cub Scout age and older are required to wear a mask during event activities except when eating/drinking or if they have a health condition that precludes them from wearing a mask.
2. Attendees and volunteers will have their temperature checked and must be under 100 to participate in any activities.
3. Cub Scouts should only camp with members of their family.
4. All families should maintain 6 feet social distance or more from other families and volunteers when possible.
5. Activity tables will be limited to two families at a time.
6. Do not eat or drink at activity/exhibit stations.
7. Hands should be washed or sanitized frequently.
8. Please follow social distance markers where marked.
9. Guests will be counted as they enter and depart. Once the event reaches 250 guests/participants, additional guest will be asked to wait until others depart.
10. Social distancing standards must be maintained at all times including outside of active event times (i.e. arrival time, between afternoon and evening activities, overnight, breaking camp, etc.).

REGISTRATION INFORMATION

- **Day Fee:** \$10.00/Cub Scout if paid by 4/14/21
- **Day/Evening/Camping Fee:** \$15.00/Cub Scout

For the \$10 or \$15 rate, registrations and payments must be made **no later than April 14, 2021.**

Individual families should register and provide payment at www.vahcbsa.org/AviationDay. Campers upload form for Medical A&B and the Camping Waiver at the time of registration or bring them completed. Units that register and pay together should use the form on page 4.

AVIATION DAY CHECK-IN

Daytime event check-in begins at 12:30pm.

Camping Check-in is from 4:15-4:45pm.

BI-PLANE RIDES AND RAFFLES

Stearman bi-plane rides may be purchased for varying amounts of time for Aviation Day. The shortest flight, about 8 minutes, is \$90 (one person per flight) and can be reserved and paid for at www.vahcbsa.org/AviationDay. Contact Fred Rollins at frollins@gmail.com if you are interested in a longer flight or have any questions. Flights may be purchased on the day of the event, but pre-registration purchases have priority. A number of flights will be raffled onsite to Cub Scout participants. Scouts must be present to win, and parents must sign a Waiver. All who fly must complete the BSA Flight Waiver available at www.vahcbsa.org/AviationDay. The completed form may be uploaded when registering or brought completed. Flights will be rescheduled in the case weather.

CUB SCOUT FAMILY CAMPING SATURDAY NIGHT

Cub Scouts and their families have the opportunity to camp the night of April 24. Webelos and Arrow of Light Scouts are not required to have a family member with them in order to camp, but another adult must take responsibility for the Scout. As usual, a Scout may not tent with adults other than their own family members. It is each Pack's responsibility to ensure that all camping adults have completed Youth Protection Training.

GENERAL CAMPSITE INFORMATION

Packs are responsible for maintaining a safe campsite. **No vehicles will be allowed to park in the camping/activity areas.** Follow the Guide to Safe Scouting. **Drinking water will be provided in jugs at a central location, but your Pack is highly encouraged to bring drinking water.** All campfires must be in an off-the-ground fire pit. Bring your campfire wood with you and a bucket for water. Take the leftover wood and ashes home! **No pets** are allowed at the camporee.

SATURDAY EVENING PROGRAM

The evening program from 7:30-9:30 will feature a tour of constellations, an inflatable planetarium, rocket copters, and telescopes (presuming it's not cloudy)!

FIRST AID

First aid will be available at the camporee. Come to the medic by the check-in tent if you have **ANY** injuries.

LOCATION OF THE EVENT

Gordonsville Municipal Airport is about 1 mile from Gordonsville in Orange County just off of VA-15 North.



SUNDAY MORNING CHAPEL

CHECKOUT PROCESS

Packs should practice LNT principles! Please pack-out all of your gear, trash, and leftover firewood and debris. Be sure to properly clean your campfire area. Units must have a staff inspect the campsite before departure.

CANCELLATION - BACK-UP DATE

Should the event need to be postponed due to rain

or extreme wind, the back-up date is **May 1-2**. Any decision to move to the back-up date will be sent to the unit leader and those who have registered online no later than noon on Friday, April 30.

DAYTIME AND CAMPING MATERIALS

There is very little shade at this location, and sun screen will be essential. Insect repellent will also be appreciated. Otherwise, plan to bring all standard camping gear.

EXCHANGE HOTEL CIVIL WAR MEDICAL MUSEUM – 400 S. Main Street

If you are looking for an engaging activity before you arrive at Aviation Day or between the afternoon and evening sessions, the [Exchange Hotel Civil War Medical Museum](#) has agreed to remain open on August 29 until 6pm to accommodate visiting Cub Scouts and their families. The museum houses a world-renowned collection of artifacts relating to medical care during the Civil War in a railroad hotel that converted to a receiving hospital during the war. Perhaps you might also get to know some of the resident ghosts! The museum has a reputation of being haunted. A visit would qualify for the Bear's Paws in Action belt loop requirement 2b. Cost is free for 0-7 years old, \$5 for 8-12, and \$12 for 13 and older.

Safe Scouting During the Pandemic for Unit Meetings, Hikes and Camping July, 2020

Safety and Risks with Scouting Activities

Being safe is not the same as risk free in the context of scout unit activities. As the response to the pandemic shifts to a state-focused, phased approach, we must strictly conduct activities following the guidelines of the State of Virginia and BSA to be safe and compliant with their guidelines.

Precautions and mitigation strategies are important, but they cannot eliminate the potential for exposure to COVID-19 or any other illness with in-person activities. People with COVID-19 may show no signs or symptoms of illness, but they can spread the virus. Some people may be contagious before their symptoms occur. The fact is, is that someone with COVID-19 may still pass the required health screenings and be allowed into program activities. Further, Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) states that as people age and people of any age who have serious underlying medical conditions are at higher risk for severe illness from COVID-19. These individuals are precluded from participation in in-person unit activities.

Traveling to and from Events/Activities

Most likely you will be traveling in a car, van or bus to your outdoors activity. When indoors (such as these vehicles) you must wear a mask and avoid physical contact. Wash or sanitize hands before getting into the vehicle and immediately afterward leaving vehicle. If you stop for food, restroom etc., again keep mask on, wash or sanitize hands after leaving vehicle and before entering vehicle.

Hiking

Hiking as a key activity for scouts of all ages. Being outdoors does help lower risk of infections and that is a positive, but as noted above, there is always some risk. To mitigate the risk as much as possible the following must be followed:

1. Attestation of pre-activity health conditions signed by parent or guardian.
2. Acknowledgement of recognition of risk associated with the activity signed by parent or guardian.
3. On-site re-check of health conditions.
4. All records are kept by leader for a minimum of four weeks after the event.
5. Physical distancing of a minimum of 10 feet outdoors without masks.
6. Masks must be worn when less than 10 feet except when eating or drinking.
7. Wash or sanitize hands at beginning of event, before and after every meal, and at the end of the event.
8. Report to adult leadership if at any time someone in the group is feeling ill. Also, report to adult leadership if an any time you diagnosed with Covid-19.

Camping

Camping like hiking is a keystone activity in scouting and likewise being conducted outdoors does help lower risks, but conversely being in a confined campsite, cooking meals and eating together as well as other troop/patrol activities may increase risks for infection. To mitigate the risk as much as possible the following must be followed:

1. Attestation of pre-activity health conditions signed by parent or guardian.
2. Acknowledgement of recognition of risk associated with the activity signed by parent or guardian.

3. On-site re-check of health conditions.
4. All records are kept by leader for a minimum of four weeks after the event.
5. Physical distancing of a minimum of 10 feet outdoors without masks.
6. Masks must be worn when less than 10 feet except when eating or drinking.
7. Wash or sanitize hands at beginning of event, before and after every meal, when you wake up and prior to going to bed and at the end of the event.
8. Sleep in a hammock or alone in a tent to reduce contact.
9. Extra precautions must be taken during food preparation, dining and clean. Regular and repeated hand washing or sanitizing during all of the activity must occur. Strict distancing during preparation and clean up must be enforced. Wearing masks during these activities are recommended. Strict distancing during dining when masks cannot be worn must be enforced.
10. If any shared troop/patrol equipment is used (i.e. axes, lashing poles, lanterns etc.) they must be disinfected prior to use and immediately after use.
11. Report to adult leadership if at any time someone in the group is feeling ill. Also, report to adult leadership if an any time you diagnosed with Covid-19.

Safety During Instructional Activities

1. In addition to the above elements for activities, for instructional sessions you must agree to follow state guidelines to minimize exposure (distancing, hygiene, masks). On arrival to the class you must wash or sanitize your hands as well as when you leave the class. For activities in the water, you will not have a mask on. In aquatic activities, the risk of exposure is greater given the lack of a mask and thus 10 feet distancing is particularly critical. All shared equipment must be sanitized before use and immediately after use. During instruction it may be necessary for you to have physical contact with the instructor or another swimmer. Avoid breathing in each other's face and limit the time of contact to a minimum. Report to adult leadership if at any time someone in the group is feeling ill. Also, report to adult leadership if an any time you diagnosed with Covid-19.

If you are involved in any of the above activities you and family must evaluate your unique circumstances and make an informed decision to participate or not, and then agree to accept the risks.

RELEASE, WAIVER AND INDEMNITY AGREEMENT

I ACKNOWLEDGE BY SIGNING THIS RELEASE, WAIVER AND INDEMNITY AGREEMENT (“AGREEMENT”) THAT I AM RELEASING AND WAIVING MY RIGHT TO SUE THE TOWN OF GORDONSVILLE, AND THEIR AGENTS, EMPLOYEES, DIRECTORS, MEMBERS, OFFICERS, AFFILIATES, CONTRACTORS AND SUCCESSORS (“RELEASED PARTIES”) FROM, AND WITH RESPECT TO ALL LIABILITY, CLAIMS, CAUSES OF ACTION, DEMANDS AND INDEBTEDNESS OF EVERY KIND AND NATURE RELATING TO MY USE OF AND PRESENCE ON PROPERTY OWNED, USED OR CONTROLLED BY THE RELEASED PARTIES. THIS AGREEMENT IS A CONTRACT WITH LEGAL CONSEQUENCES. I HAVE READ IT CAREFULLY BEFORE SIGNING.

I hereby request that the Released Parties allow me to access and use the Town Airport Property and surrounding land (hereafter the “Property”) for recreational purposes. I shall comply with the Town rules. I understand that this Agreement shall remain in force for ten (10) days from execution hereof and may only be extended by a written agreement of all parties. To induce the Released Parties to grant me permission to use the Town Airport Property, I hereby agree as follows: In consideration of being allowed the use and be present on the Property, or any portion thereof, I, for myself and my heirs and personal representatives, hereby RELEASE the Released Parties from and WAIVE MY RIGHTS TO SUE them with respect to all liability, claims, causes of action, demands and indebtedness of every kind and nature, at law or in equity, which I and my personal heirs and representatives may have or assert including, but not limited to, all rights and claims arising from or based upon any bodily injury, death or property damage which may occur during my use of or presence on the Property, including, without limitation, any claims arising from my own negligence and from the negligence of any Released Party.

I HEREBY HOLD HARMLESS AND INDEMNIFY the Released Parties with respect to all liability, claims, indebtedness, damages and expenses (including attorney’s fees) which are claimed, asserted or assessed by third parties against the Released Parties as a result of or in connection with my use of or presence on the Property.

I UNDERSTAND AND EXPRESSLY AND FULLY ASSUME ALL RISKS ASSOCIATED WITH MY USE OF AND PRESENCE ON THE PROPERTY INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, PERSONAL INJURY AND DEATH, AND ACKNOWLEDGE THAT THE RELEASED PARTIES OR ANYONE ON THEIR BEHALF WILL NOT BE AVAILABLE TO PROVIDE ANY ASSISTANCE TO ME IN CONNECTION WITH ANY INCIDENT WHICH MAY CAUSE PERSONAL INJURY OR DEATH.

I agree, for myself, my heirs, my next of kin, and my successors, that this Agreement is binding on me, my heirs, my next of kin, and my successors and that the above representations are contractually binding and are not mere recitals. I further agree that if I, my successors, my heirs or next of kin, assert a claim in contravention of this Agreement that I and my successors, heirs and next of kin shall be liable for the expenses (including legal fees) incurred by the Released Parties. I understand and agree that this Agreement may not be modified orally, and understand that a waiver of any provision must be in writing and signed by the Released Party to be affected thereby in every instance. This Agreement shall remain valid until revoked in writing and shall be binding. I agree that I am allowed to be present only on the Property; however, I further agree that if I am present on other property owned by a Released Party that this Agreement shall apply with full force and effect with respect to my use of and presence thereon.

I agree that this Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Virginia and that any legal proceeding relating to this Agreement or my presence on or use of the Property shall be brought and maintained in the Circuit Court for the County of Orange, Virginia.
